Our Three Primary Initiatives

MENTOR PROGRAM

IAAE has advocated for and received a \$25,000 annual appropriation from the Iowa Legislature for the past seven legislative sessions to fund the **Iowa Model of Excellence Mentoring Program** for beginning fine arts teachers. IAAE also successfully raised the required matching funds. In 2023, IAAE was able to increase the amount of the state appropriation to \$50,000 and that matching funds can include in-kind contributions in addition to cash contributions up to \$50,000 a year.

ADVOCACY

Since 2014, IAAE has sponsored an annual **Arts Advocacy Day at the State Capitol** where all 150 Iowa legislators are informed about the impact that arts education has on Iowa students. IAAE is member of the Creativity & Innovation working group of the Iowa STEM Council. Plans are underway for our **next Arts Advocacy Day in January of 2024**.

IAAE collaborates with Americans for the Arts (AFTA) to communicate with the Iowa congressional delegation in Washington D.C. to advocate for increased funding for the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and federal government programs that benfit art education.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

IAAE was a driving force in the adoption of Fine Arts
Standards for the state of Iowa.
To highlight the importance of the standards in improving student achievement, promoting social & emotional learning, and advancing equity and inclusion, IAAE partnered with the Iowa Arts Council to sponsor an Arts Education
Summit in June of 2023. The next summit is planned for June of 2025.

*IAAE provided additional professional development for teachers by sponsoring the **Arts Educators Leadership Institute** in June of 2022. The purpose of this event is to train "up and coming" fine arts teachers to be leaders in their schools, communities, and state-wide organizations. The next leadership institute is planned for **June of 2024**.

The purpose of this program is to improve the quality of arts education in Iowa through mentoring assistance of beginning fine arts teachers.

This program has been in operation since 2006 and is made possible by an appropriation from the Iowa legislature and matching funds from the Iowa Alliance for Arts Education.

IAAE functions as administrator of the program under contract with the Iowa Department of Education. The Iowa Model of Excellence Mentor Program is **discipline-specific** and is designed to **enhance**, not supplant, the **current district mentoring programs**.

The IAAE mentoring program provides the following services to all first and second year teachers at **NO-COST** to the local school district.

- Unlimited full-day on-site mentor visits by assigned mentors of all arts disciplines.
- Unlimited "virtual mentor visits" (Zoom, Go To Meeting, Google Meet, etc.).
- Scholarships to attend professional conferences and pay professional dues.
- "Fall Symposium for Beginning Arts Educators" was held on October 29, 2022.




IAAE's Benefit Concert for the 'Model of Exellence' Mentor Program with John Lloyd Young October 2022

The Iowa Alliance for Arts Education hosted **John Lloyd Young**, **the original "Frankie Valli" in Broadway's Tony Award-winning Best Musical**, *Jersey Boys*, at Noce Jazz Club in Des Moines, Iowa for a benefit concert for the IAAE's Model of Excellence Mentor Program on Tuesday, October 4, 2022.

All funds raised during this event went to support the statewide IAAE Model of Excellence Mentor Program. Mr. Young donated his time and talents to help raise awareness for the importance of fine arts education in Iowa.

John Lloyd Young is an ardent supporter of the arts and fine arts education. He was appointed to the President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities by Barack Obama, Young was sworn in at the Supreme Court of the United States by Justice Elena Kagan. As a member of the Committee, Young represented the United States on the first U.S. Cultural Mission to the Republic of Cuba, along with fellow Committee members Kal Penn and Alfre Woodard, guest artists Usher, Smokey Robinson, Dave Matthews, violinist Joshua Bell, playwright John Guare, U.S. arts officials, including the Chairs of the NEA and the Smithsonian Institution and members of Congress.









Fall Symposium October 2022

On Saturday, October 29, 2022, the **Fall Symposium for Beginning Arts Educators** was held on the campus of Iowa Central Community College in Fort Dodge. The Symposium is one of the professional development components of the **"Iowa Model of Excellence" Mentoring Program** of the Iowa Alliance for Arts Education. This event was coordinated by the IAAE mentor committee and mentor Co-Administrators Cassidy Noring and Leon Kuehner.

Beginning fine arts teachers from all subject areas gathered together for a day of sharing and learning skills to assist them during the beginning years of their teaching career. In addition to the plenary sessions of "How I Survived & Thrived During My First Year of Teaching" and "Creating the Mentor-Mentee Relationship", discipline-specific sessions were held by the mentor chairs of the Art Educators of Iowa, Iowa Bandmasters Association, Iowa Choral Directors Association, Iowa Music Educators Association, and Iowa String Teachers Association.

Fine Arts Education Advocacy Day 2023

The IAAE's Arts Education Virtual Advocacy Day took place on Wednesday, January 18, 2023. We advocate and lobby for policy change and new opportunities that support fine arts education in Iowa.

We had 135 virtual advocates this year covering 61 of Iowa's 99 counties. It was important for us to reach as many representatives this year as there were so many new legislators in the 2023 session.

Detailed information was sent to all registered virtual advocates along with a video created by IAAE leadership informing our legislators of the importance of fine arts education in our rural and urban communities.
